

KRFC Membership Policy

Approved May 5, 2006

There are 2 ways to become an active, voting member of KRFC. Membership dues may be paid or individuals may perform volunteer work for KRFC. Each membership (individual, household or business) is entitled to one vote at annual and special meetings of KRFC, as described in KRFC's bylaws (see addendum, below).

1. Becoming a member by paying membership dues: The KRFC Board of Directors and staff determine on an annual basis the minimum dues required for membership. Membership is active for 12 months following payment of dues in the minimum amount or greater.
2. Becoming a member by volunteering at KRFC: Individuals may become members by volunteering at KRFC. After providing at least 12 hours of documented service (officially logged), membership is active for the following 12 months. Volunteers are responsible for activating their memberships by completing and submitting a KRFC Volunteer Member form, available from the volunteer coordinator. In order to keep their membership active, volunteers must provide a minimum of 12 hours service for KRFC each year.

In the event that the KRFC Board of Directors revokes a membership, the ex-member may ask that his or her pro-rated membership dues be refunded. These will be refunded promptly. The former member may continue to make monetary donations or volunteer at KRFC. In this case, monetary donations and volunteer work are not considered as proof of membership. Membership may only be reinstated by KRFC's Board of Directors.

Addendum:

*Article III: General Membership, Voting
Section 1: Membership.*

The members of the Corporation shall be known as "members". Members consist of those who have paid annual dues or who perform a number of volunteer hours in an amount to be determined by the Corporation's Board of Directors and who are held to be in good standing by the Board of Directors.

Members shall not conduct any activity that is detrimental to the welfare of the Corporation. Such conduct shall result in membership revocation as deemed by the Board of Directors. No member shall have any right, title, or interest in any of the property or assets of the Corporation.

The various categories of membership shall be determined by the Board of Directors.

Memberships are not transferable.

Section 2: Voting.

Members in good standing of the Corporation are entitled, either in person or by absentee ballot, to one vote. In order to be eligible to vote on an issue, members shall be in good standing as of the original date of general announcement of the annual or special meeting called to discuss the issue. A majority vote by the entire membership is binding on any issue of the Corporation, except when it is contrary to the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation or Federal Communications Commission regulations, or when such vote materially alters the Mission Statement.
